

A Note on Parking for the DuPage Valley Conference Cross Country Championships Friday, October 17th, 2008

(Please pass on to parents, bus drivers or any other relevant personnel.)

Parking for the Friday DVC Championship Meet will be somewhat limited. Busses will be asked to park at the Hobby Lobby parking lot just south of the park on S. Washington Street/Weber Road. This is only about a quarter mile from the park. Spectators arriving at or near the beginning of the meet should have no problem, but late arrivers may need to have an alternative plan for parking. For this, we have three options in the event that the parking lot is full...

Option #1 – Park in DuPage River Park Parking Lot. This is the closest option, but will fill very fast. Link to map - <http://www.gmap-pedometer.com/?r=2333331>

Option #2 – Park in the Hobby Lobby lot with the busses. It is a quarter-mile walk from there on the side of the road. You don't have to cross the road, but there is no sidewalk. Therefore, one would have to walk about a quarter mile on a grass trail to get to the meet. Link to map - <http://www.gmap-pedometer.com/?r=2336691>

Option #3 – Park in the neighborhood across the street from the park off of Royce Road. Royce dead-ends into the park, and there is a neighborhood across the street where parking on the street is legal. Depending on where one parks, this is only a few blocks from the park and there are sidewalks, a stoplight and a cross walk to get into the park. Option #4 – Park in Knoch Knolls Park. This is a creative option, but effective if you know where you're going. From DuPage River Park, go north and follow Washington Street to Ring Road. Take a left on Ring and a quick left on Knoch Knolls Road. Take Knoch Knolls Road to the park on the left. Park there and then cross the DuPage River on the stone bridge near the parking lot. This is actually on the course in the back loop. Follow the painted course line left (east) to the main park. This is about a half-mile walk, but it will be marked. This is a good option for those looking for a nice walk or who are willing to bring a mountain bike (which can help for spectators in the back loop anyway!).
